Who Wants to Be an FBLA Leader?

Overview: This 45-minute lesson plan is designed for advisers to highlight the different programs and opportunities that FBLA provides, focusing on what students should be concentrating on for the second semester to get the most out of their membership and to help them build their leadership skills.

Business Class: This lesson is designed to integrate into any business class for grades 9-12.

Objective: To introduce FBLA members to the different programs and activities that they can get involved with during the second part of the FBLA year and to motivate them to participate so that they can build their communications skills and explore career development options.
